## **Curriculum Sample**

#### A Grade Ahead will challenge your students and help them achieve their goals!

This school year, our academy's 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students will be participating in A Grade Ahead's Blended Learning program that integrates both traditional and electronic methods to teach students.

Each week, students attend a weekly class, either in person or online, and learn a lesson from a teacher. Together, the class completes practice problems to understand the weekly topic.




#### A Grade Ahead Online Activities


- Interactive and colorful questions with formats like matching, drag and drop, fill in the blank, multiple choice, and more.





**Teaching Tip:** Students should already be familiar with capitalization, especially capitalizing the first word in a sentence and the word "I." Be sure to emphasize that you only capitalize "I" when it stands alone in a sentence.

- (1) The first word of each sentence
- (2) Using the word "I"



**Example:** When I was younger, I wanted to be a nurse.



**Teaching Tip:** Students will be less familiar with proper nouns. Write the categories of proper nouns (listed below) on the board or a separate sheet of paper. Have students give you examples of each category without looking at this example sheet. For even more practice, have students write their examples in a sentence.

**Teaching Tip:** If there is still some time left after the class, you can play a game with the students.

Come up with a sentence. This sentence should have some words that should be capitalized. Say this sentence to the class once. Then, repeat the sentence, only this time say it slowly. Ask the students to stand up when they hear a word that should be capitalized.

Example: You can say the sentence, "Laura and I went to New York for summer vacation." The students should stand when they hear the word Laura, I, and New York.
